### Commentary on Sunday's Reading's

In this profound passage the Apostle Paul calls us to humility. He then shows us how Jesus is the supreme example of humility for He was perfectly obedient and gave Himself completely for our sake. Jesus died so that we can have life. It takes humility, though, on our part, to receive that life. If we act like the Israelites in the first reading with pride, then we remain in our sin and do not have life. But if we humbly recognize our brokenness and repent, we can have life. We will see in the Gospel reading this dichotomy between the two sons. One is humble, the other is prideful.

As Christ emptied himself, we are called to empty ourselves and live for God. This means dying to ourselves and choosing to not live for selfish gain but selflessly giving our entire lives to God. Humility involves recognizing any wrongdoing and repenting of that sin. Then, we are called to give ourselves completely to the love of God and of others. To reach out to those who are in any need, to be the hands and feet of Jesus today and always. Christ has no body now but yours.
