## Shepherds who smell of their sheep

Today is Good Shepherd Sunday, so named because of the excerpt from the Gospel of John in which Jesus speaks about himself as the 'good shepherd'. It is also known as a day of prayer for vocations. What makes a good shepherd? John tells us that the good shepherd is willing to lay down his life for his sheep. The shepherd is at the service of his sheep. What a simple yet profound model for those with leadership roles in our church, and indeed for all of us.

Pope Francis used quite a vivid image in this context a while back, calling on priests to be 'shepherds with the smell of sheep'. In *The Joy of the Gospel*, he places this responsibility on all of us: 'Each Christian and every community... all of us are asked to obey his call to go forth from our own comfort zone in order to reach all the 'peripheries.' We cannot be at the service of people unless we know them, spend time with them and understand where they are coming from. We must be willing to serve, wherever help is needed.

A good shepherd does not remain indoors, watching from afar, hoping everything will be okay with his flock. He must be out among them in order to be able to protect and help them.

### THOUGHT FOR THE WEEK

#### Message from Pope Francis for World Day of Prayer for Vocations (extract)

To offer one's life in mission is possible only if we are able to leave ourselves behind. On this 52<sup>nd</sup> World Day of Prayer for Vocations, I would like reflect on that particular "exodus" which is the heart of vocation, or better yet, of our response to the vocation God gives us. When we hear the word "exodus", we immediately think of the origins of the amazing love story between God and his people, a history which passes through the dramatic period of slavery in Egypt, the calling of Moses, the experience of liberation and the journey toward the Promised Land. The Book of Exodus, the second book of the Bible, which recounts these events is a parable of the entire history of salvation, but also of the inner workings of Christian faith. Passing from the slavery of the old Adam to new life in Christ is an event of redemption which takes place through faith (*Eph* 4:22-24). This passover is a genuine "exodus"; it is the journey of each Christian soul and the entire Church, the decisive turning of our lives towards the Father.
