In the immediate aftermath of the horrific bomb attack in Manchester on 22 May this year, the hashtag #roomformanchester began to trend on social media. In the midst of the chaos and terror, locals were opening up their homes and hearts to anyone who had been affected by the incident and was in need of help. People who lived nearby offered food or a cuppa, a place to charge phones, or a bed for the night. Hotels took in dozens of children and teenagers who had been separated from their parents. Taxi drivers offered free lifts, and others offered to drive those who had been stranded home to surrounding areas. People began to queue up at donor banks to give blood to help those injured in the attack. In the face of an evil and senseless act that inflicted so much pain, kindness and goodness shone through.

Difficult times often bring out the best in people. We can see it in the way friends rally around a bereaved family, or communities raise money to help a sick child. There are treasures in our people and our communities that we could never put a price on. Jesus talks today about hidden treasures and fine pearls, and prompts the question – what is most important to us, and what are we willing to sacrifice for it? Sometimes treasures like compassion and love are there for all to see, and other times we have to go in search of them, and to remember to bring them to others. Message from Fr. John

'Just a quick update on my health. Last week I had a meeting with the Urologist. He informed me that the chemotherapy has done its work and what remains of the tumour is benign.

He said when he operates it will probably just fall out into his hand.

Because of the clot in my leg, he will be unable to do the operation until mid-September.

He told me I can resume my 'normal' life, walking swimming, playing golf, but just to listen to my body. I still have very little energy and it will take some time to recover my full energy.

When I mentioned my planned trip for October/November, he said I would have to postpone this because of the clot.

The most prudent thing I can do at the moment is to take it day by day.

The wonderful news is that what remains is benign, when I get through surgery I will have a clearer idea about my plans for the future.
