### The Parable of the Mustard Seed

The mustard seed was the smallest seed, but it grew into a huge plant. This is Mark's third parable of growth.

In this parable, Jesus teaches that although the Kingdom of God started small, with Jesus and the disciples, it would grow and spread across the world to unlimited numbers of followers.

The birds represent Gentile people, those who were not Jews. Jesus is saying that the Kingdom of God will include other nations and all people not just God's chosen people, the Jews.

Mark's Gentile readers would have taken great comfort and hope from this parable. And we too can take comfort knowing that we are people of God, that his love, care and promise of eternal life is ours. On our part we must love God and our neighbour, to be Christ to those we meet.

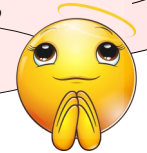
