## Fourth Sunday of Lent

We meet Nicodemus in our gospel today...but what happened to him after his encounter with Jesus? We don't know. But we know he remained very close to Jesus and the next time we find him in the Gospel it is when Jesus is on the cross and Jesus dies on the cross, and Joseph of Arimathea, another secret disciple, took the body, both he and Nicodemus took the body down from the cross, and Nicodemus laid the body of Jesus in the arms of his mother.

In Michelangelo's portrait of taking Jesus down from the cross, you will see in the centre of the picture, a man filled with sadness and sorrow, but holding the body of Jesus and bringing him down from the cross to be given to his mother. And that is the end of Nicodemus, but it is said of him that he, too, became a disciple, and that he lived the life of a fervent, fervent lover of Jesus himself.

That is the story of Nicodemus. Was he a coward for going in the night? No. He was being prudent, because as a leader of the Jews he didn't want anybody to have misunderstandings and he knew that he was there just to find out what Jesus really was like — and he found out.

What kind of a person was he then? He was a courageous man, for at the time when Jesus was beaten, when Jesus was nailed to the cross, when the whole countryside was screaming at him for being a fraud, it was this little Nicodemus that actually climbed the cross and brought him down. And he brought with him myrrh and many spices, and he washed the body of Jesus with Joseph. And the two of them, with strips filled with the myrrh and the perfume, they wrapped the body of Jesus and put him in a grave, a grave that no-one had been in before, and then they turned back and went home.

And so, when we think of our approaching Holy Week, when we think of our approaching our ordinary things that we do for Jesus during this time, we should remember that our faith is based on the quiet heroism of the most peculiar people, and one of them, of course, is the Pharisee who took Jesus and gave him back to his mother. ## Introducing a Ritual for use when a priest is unexpectedly absent on a Sunday

For years now we have been aware of the falling number of vocations to the priesthood, especially in the Irish church and our own diocese. Many of you will remember 3 priests in Borris parish, 2 in St. Mullins and 3 in Graigue-namanagh; today there are just 3 of us in the 3 parishes. This is echoed around our diocese and indeed around the country. In response to challenges this poses, Bishop Denis asked the Diocesan Commission for Liturgical Formation to prepare a text for use on a Sunday when a priest is absent in circumstances that are unplanned and/or unexpected, it could be sudden illness of a priest or a death in a priests family. Whatever it may be it would be good and appropriate that a community gather to pray and receive Holy Communion in his absence.

A session will be offered in three locations on the first three Tuesdays of March to introduce the materials to be used on such occasions. The session will give the context for its use, the content, and practical implications. Priests and deacons are invited to attend and also people who may interested in leading this celebration on the day, if and when, such a celebration takes place in the parish.

Those who might consider attending one of these sessions may include the Sacristan, choir director/ music leader, co-ordinator of Readers and Eucharistic Ministers. But it is open to all adults who practice their faith in the parish and I extend that invite to you.
