Parish Accounts

This week I am publishing the Parish Accounts covering the past four years. Over that time there has been a cycle of profit and loss. Notable is the decline in shrine income and basket & envelope collections. There has been over the years a decline in the number of people receiving and seeking the boxes of envelopes available during the month of September and covering the year beginning October 1st.

These envelopes also cover all collections for the support of me and retired priests. With an aging profile of priests in the diocese and a falloff in vocations, we rely more and more on priests who are retired, all of whom are 75yrs or older.

Additional envelops cover donations to Mission Sunday 19th October and November Dead List 2nd November.

Another very notable drop in parish income is from Tax Refunds. Any parishioner who donates more than €250 in a twelve month period can apply to revenue for a tax refund as a charitable donation. As a charity we as a parish receive that refund and it goes to the day to day running of the parish. If you are in a position to avail of this way of donating to the Parish forms for this purpose are available from the Parish Office.

Over the years there have been repairs and improvements made throughout the Parish, notably to each of the Churches and the Parochial House. I would like to acknowledge the great work done by committees and Parishioners in raising additional funds for these projects, all are fully paid up with no outstanding loans or debts. This is a credit to your hard work and kindness.

I am very conscious of the difficult financial times we live in, the cost of living has spiralled in the last number of years and by all accounts will continue to do so.

I would encourage you and ask that where you can, you continue your support of your Church, spiritually and financially. This is not just financially, but in time or services you can give to the Parish, to help grow our faith community in the years ahead.

Thank you for your support of me over the past 9 years and I look forward to working with you as best I can for many years to come.
